



Boise Centre Health Crisis Acknowledgement and Guidelines

Boise Centre recognizes the inherent challenges when scheduling and executing an event during uncertain times, especially when a health crisis impacts the general population. As we work together in good faith, both parties enter into the Use Permit agreement acknowledging that while COVID-19 persists, each party is committed to holding the event over the contracted dates. To alleviate concerns and instill confidence, Boise Centre is committed to leading events through adjustments that will be made to our otherwise standard operating procedures as outlined in the Rules and Regulations and Event Promoter Guide. The following guidelines will be implemented in the event of a health crisis and will be adjusted according to mandates issued by local, state, and federal health authorities.

1. User is required to track registrations or maintain an accurate sign in sheet for all staff, attendees, vendors, and/or guests, and shall provide this list to Boise Centre upon request to allow for any necessary contact tracking recommended by health authorities. This list must be maintained and available for a minimum of forty-five (45) days after User's event.

2. While health crisis situations can vary, Boise Centre's basic guidelines may require:
 - All individuals be subject to temperature screenings when entering the facility by use of thermal imaging cameras or other such devices deemed acceptable by local, state, or federal health agencies, and any restrictions related to temperature ranges will be followed.
 - Physical distancing in public spaces and within contracted space.
 - Enforcement of all other protocols required by local, state, or federal health authorities.

3. When and where possible, public access shall be designated as either entrance or exit only to limit pedestrian cross traffic and encourage physical distancing.

4. User shall adhere to all building requirements intended to meet or exceed guidelines set forth by local, state, and federal health authorities and in effect at the time of the event.

5. User acknowledges that coronaviruses are a large family of viruses that can cause illness ranging from the common cold to more severe diseases and that the current or any future outbreak, strain, or mutation of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19) is unknown. Mitigation efforts and precautionary measures may reduce the risk of exposure or illness. User acknowledges that Boise Centre will continue to operate unless mandates set forth by local, state, and/or federal authorities result in its inability to accommodate events or should circumstances set forth in Section 18. Force Majeure apply. User also acknowledges that the continued existence of COVID-19 and/or any future strain and/or mutation does not in itself equate to a Force Majeure occurrence and agrees to work in good faith with Boise Centre to hold the Event over the contracted dates.
